### Scouting report

Concord is coming off a sectional championship last season. ... The Minutemen are led by senior forwards Filip Serwatka and Brett Austin. Austin led Concord in scoring against Glenn last week with 17 points. ... Serwatka, a 6-foot-5 Division I prospect, finished with 15 points and 5 rebounds in the game against Glenn. ... Concord's two losses came against Michigan City and Glenn. ... The Kingsmen lead the all-time series against Concord 48-27. ... Penn beat Concord in the regional last season 66-51. ... Penn also beat Concord 66-48 in the regular season in 2013-2014.

### Coach Al Rhodes

Al Rhodes attended Penn High School and then went on to graduate from Tri-State and Indiana University. He coached at Warsaw, Logansport, and Northrop before coming back to Penn.

Rhodes guided Warsaw to a state championship in 1984. The latest addition to his long list of accolades is being inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010.

Coach Rhodes is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Kingsmen. Last season the Kingsmen were 23-2 and won the Northern Indiana Conference title with a 7-1 record. Penn also won the South Bend sectional title. Coach Rhodes owns an overall record of 541-244 in 34 seasons overall and 87-52 in seven seasons at Penn.

Kreiger, a freshman guard, is ranked first in the nation with 16-of-16 free throws for a 100.0 free-throw shooting percentage.

Kreiger is a talented and highly skilled athlete and has demonstrated it throughout the years. He had a wonderful high school career and has shown major improvement over the years. So far this season at Anderson, Kreiger averages 5.8 points, 1.3 rebounds, and 0.8 assists per game.

In a game vs. Illinois Tech, Krieger was 8-of-8 from the free-throw line and had a career-high 17 points in a 91-38 win.

## Torres helps Irish

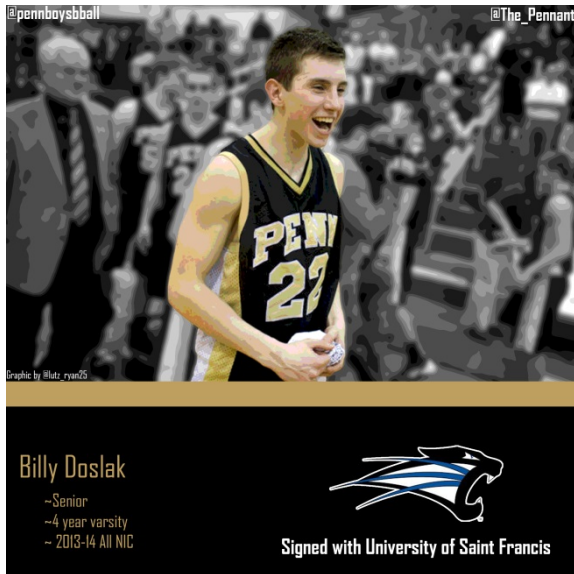
In recent events, Notre Dame basketball player and Penn alum Austin Torres has been getting expanded minutes for the Irish this year.

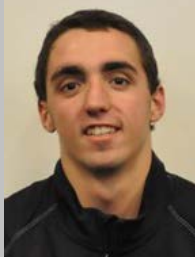

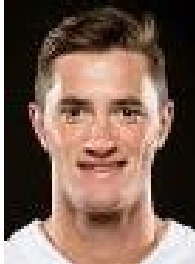

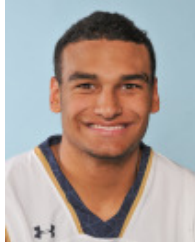
