Penn leads the series vs. Mishawaka 47-15-1. ... This will be the final meeting between Penn and Mishawaka as Northern Indiana Conference rivals. ... Mishawaka is leaving the NIC for the Northern Lakes Conference after the 2019-2020 school year. ... Mishawaka defeated Penn 49-42 in overtime last season. ... If New Prairie loses to Elkhart Central on Friday (10.18.2019), the winner of the Penn-Mishawaka game will share the Northern Indiana Conference North Division title with New Prairie. ... Mishawaka halfback Donovan Snyder gained 238 yards on 23 carries in Mishawaka's 15-6 victory against Marian last Friday. ... Mishawaka limited No. 4 (Class 3-A) Marian to 83 yards rushing and 47 yards passing.

Penn coach Cory Yeoman

Penn head coach Cory Yeoman has a 178-38 record in his 17th season as the Kingsmen head coach, starting in 2003. Yeoman has guided Penn to semistate titles in 2017, 2015, 2011, and 2003. The Kingsmen have won nine regional crowns under Yeoman's guidance, 11 sectional titles and 14 Northern Indiana Conference championships.

Coach Yeoman played at Penn High School, earning all-state honors at defensive tackle. In 1979, Coach Yeoman led a Kingsmen defense that only allowed 33 yards rushing a game. He graduated from Penn in 1980. Coach Yeoman is in the Indiana Football Hall of Fame, the first Penn player nominated for the Hall.

After his playing career at Penn, coach Yeoman played for Miami (Ohio) University. He has served as an assistant or head coach with Penn football for 36 seasons.

TCU sponsors Freed Field



Penn High School made a ground-breaking deal in 2015 when it reached a deal for the naming rights of Freed Field with Teachers Credit Union.

TCU/Freed Field is the result of a new sponsorship deal with TCU that brings \$396,000 to Penn-Harris-Madison schools.

Freed Field is the latest Penn field to be sponsored, that's why it has made local and national news and media. Penn has started to let families or businesses sponsor a field, gym, or classroom for a contract, making Penn one of the leaders in the nation for public schools to engaging in corporate sponsorships.

Where does this money go? This money is going to the Penn-Harris-Madison Education Foundation. What this does is give money and grants to school programs that the state can't provide money to. This money does not just go to that sport or program, it goes to the corporation's education foundation to benefit not just the athlete, but the student in student-athlete or just student.



This deal is major, because Freed Field brings in the largest crowds through out the year, because it hosts football, band, track, and lacrosse.

The TCU deal will last 13 years, and all money goes to the PHM Education Foundation.

TCU has been a proud longstanding supporter of Penn High School and has contributed financial support to many of our academic and athletic programs in the past. Penn High's Kingsmen suffered a 34-14 loss to Valparaiso in the high school football season opener.

Tye Zahner highlighted the Kingsmen defensive effort with an interception at the Penn 4 that he returned 50 yards.

Kyle Riffel blasted into the end zone from the two-yard line to put the Kingsmen on the scoreboard in the second quarter.

Nathan Hurbough sprinted past the Valpo secondary to haul in a 25-yard Ron Powlus TD strike in the fourth quarter.

Braden Primrose kicked two extra points for the Kingsmen.

Game 2: Fri., Aug. 30 PENN 33, LaPorte 6 At TCU/Freed Field, Penn High School

Penn quarterback Ron Powlus launched four TD strikes and passed for 259 yards, and the Kingsmen rolled to a 33-6 victory against LaPorte in the home opener.

Penn struck first. Patrick Maclin blocked the punt and put the Kingsmen on the board with a six-yard scoop and score at the 4:23 mark of the first quarter.

LaPorte quickly struck back.

Powlus directed a pair of scoring drives in the second quarter to give Penn a 21-6 halftime lead. Powlus hit Nick Favilla for a 34-yard score with 10:11 left in the second quarter, and found Favilla again for a 14-yard strike with 3:48 left in the second quarter.

In the second half, Powlus launched two more TD passes, 20 yards to Carson Mumaw in the third quarter, and 10 yards to Casey Shultz.

Kyle Riffel spearheaded the Kingsmen ground game with 139 yards rushing.

Game 3: Fri., Sept. 6

Homewood-Flossmoor 35, PENN 7 At TCU/Freed Field, Penn High School

Homewood-Flossmoor, ranked No. 2 in Class 8-A in Illinois, scored a 35-7 victory against Penn in the first meeting between the two traditional high school powerhouses.

H-F star running back Sean Allen rushed for 258 yards on 27 carries, scoring four touchdowns. He averaged 9.6 yards a carry.

Penn running back Kyle Riffel gained 108 yards on 18 carries.

Nick Favilla started at quarterback for the Kingsmen in place of Ron Powlus, who was injured in the LaPorte game. Favilla was a wide receiver.

Game 4: Fri., Sept. 13

St. Xavier 37, PENN 7 At TCU/Freed Field, Penn High School

St. Xavier of Cincinnati, ranked No. 39 in the nation, defeated the Kingsmen 37-

7.

It was the first time the two traditional gridiron powers played against each other. Penn running back Kyle Riffel turned in the top highlight for the Kingsmen. Riffel pulled off a tackle-breaking, change-of-direction 72-yard touchdown run.

Game 5: Fri., Sept. 20 PENN 62, South Bend Adams 32 At TCU/Freed Field, Penn High School

Penn's offense erupted for 62 points and 396 yards rushing in a victory against the Eagles. Alec Hardrict scored three touchdowns for the Kingsmen, and Kyle Riffel and Nick Favilla rushed for two touchdowns each. Nick Hardrict scored on an 85-yard kickoff return, and Nate Ehmer scored Penn's final touchdown on a seven-yard blast.

Game 6: Sat., Sept. 28

PENN 34, South Bend St. Joseph 2 At Father Bly Field, South Bend St. Joseph H.S.

Penn High's Football Team turn in outstanding efforts on offense and defense as the Kingsmen defeated South Bend St. Joseph, 34-2, on Saturday, Sept. 28, 2019. The game was postponed from Friday, Sept. 27, 2019, due to lightning.

Shortly after the 10 a.m. kickoff at St. Joe's Father Bly Field, Penn took command.

Running back Kyle Riffel led Penn with three touchdowns - eight, three and three yards.

Quarterback Nick Favilla scored on a 12-yard run.

Penn's Wild Bunch didn't allow any touchdowns by the Indians.

Defensive back Nick Hardrict scored on 23-yard interception return.

Game 7: Fri., Oct. 4

New Prairie 21, PENN 17 At Amzie Miller Field, New Prairie High School

Penn waged a fierce comeback against No. 1 (Class 4-A) New Prairie but fell short, 21-17, on Friday, Oct. 4.

New Prairie scored to take a 21-17 lead with 45 seconds left in the game. Penn drove into New Prairie territory, but a last-second pass by Penn was incomplete.

Quarterback Nick Favilla led Penn with 101 yards rushing and 114 yards passing.

Kyle Riffel scored Penn's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to tie the score at 7-7. Tommy Castline's 34-yard field goal gave Penn a 10-7 lead.

After New Prairie took a 14-10 lead, Favilla fired a TD strike to Casey Shultz (5 yards) to give Penn a 17-14 lead with 7:36 left in the fourth quarter.

Game 8: Fri., Oct. 11

PENN 21, Elkhart Central 19 At TCU/Freed Field

Penn's 'Wild Bunch' Defense made a stand on a two-point conversion with 3:00 left, helping the Kingsmen turn back Elkhart Central, 21-19.

Penn took a 7-0 lead when Kyle Riffel scored on a six-yard run with 1:18 left in the first quarter. Elkhart Central tied the score at 7-7 with 5:12 left in the third quarter.

Nick Favilla put the Kingsmen on top again, sprinting 14 yards for a touchdown with :28 left in the third quarter.

Favilla punched it in from the one-yard line with 7:11 in the fourth quarter. Tommy Castline's third extra point of the game gave Penn a 21-13 lead.

After Elkhart Central scored with 3:00 left in the game, Nick Hardrict slowed down the Blue Blazers' ball carrier on the two-point attempt, and Caleb Suski finished the play.
