### **Coach Al Rhodes**

Al Rhodes attended Penn High School and then went on to graduate from Tri-State and Indiana University.

Rhodes coached at Warsaw, Logansport, and Fort Wayne Northrop before coming back to Penn.

Rhodes guided Warsaw to a state championship in 1984. One of the latest additions to his long list of accolades is being inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010.

Coach Rhodes is in his 11th season as the head coach of the Kingsmen.

Coach Rhodes owns an overall record of 619-288 in 38 seasons overall and 165-96 in 11 seasons at Penn.

## LAFAYETTE JEFFERSON SEMI-STATE NEXT STOP FOR PENN

The Penn Boys Basketball Team (24-3) will play Carmel (24-1) at 3:45 p.m. on Saturday, March 15, in the Class 4-A Semi-state at Lafayette Jefferson High School.

The winner advances to the Class 4-A State Championship Game, which is set for 8:15 p.m. on Saturday, March 23, at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

The Penn-Carmel winner will play the winner of the South Semi-state the State Championship game. Indianapolis Ben Davis (19-7) plays Center Grove (21-8) in the South Semi-state at 6 p.m. on Saturday, March 16, and Washington High School in Washington, Ind.

## THE CLASS 4-A FINAL FOUR SCOUTING REPORT

Penn, Carmel, Indianapolis Ben Davis and Center Grove comprise the Class 4-A Final Four. The Kingsmen, members of the Northern Indiana Conference, are the only non-Metropolitan Interscholastic Conference school in the Final Four in Class 4-A. Carmel, Ben Davis and Center Grove each compete in the MIC.

**PENN KINGSMEN (24-3):** Penn owns one Semi-state Championship – 2001. ... Penn is seeking its first State Championship in Boys Basketball. ... The Kingsmen won their seventh Regional Championship in Boys Basketball on Saturday, March 9, in Michigan City. ... Penn beat Chesterton, 49-42, and Northridge, 74-72, to claim the crown. ... Penn boasts two 1,000-point scorers on the same team for the first time in Kingsmen Boys Basketball Program history. ... Noah Applegate is Penn's All-Time Scoring Leader and has 1,702 points in his career. ... Drew Lutz has 1,062 points in his career. ... Noah Applegate scored 28 points in the Regional Championship Game against Northridge. ... Drew Lutz scored 19 points and dished out 10 assists against Northridge in the title game. ... Beau Ludwick scored 19 points for Penn in the Regional Championship Game. ... The Kingsmen have won 17 of their last 18 games.

**CARMEL GREYHOUNDS (24-1):** Carmel owns six Semi-state Championships, the last one in 2018. ... Carmel is seeking its fourth State Championship. ... Carmel was State Runner-up last season, losing 54-48 to Warren Central. ... The Greyhounds are led by 6-foot-10 Senior John Michael Mulloy (14.2 points, 8.2 rebounds a game), who will be playing basketball at Butler next year. ... Another big piece for Carmel is 6-6 Senior Andrew Owens (11.6 ppg) who will be playing next year at Findlay University. ... Karsten Windlan (11.8 ppg) led Carmel with 18 points in the Regional Championship Game against Zionsville. ... Carmel hit 10-of-22 three-pointers against Zionsville. ... Carmel has won its last 13 games in a row.

**BEN DAVIS GIANTS (19-7):** Ben Davis owns five Semi-state Championships, the last one in 2017. ... Ben Davis is seeking its fourth State Championship. ... The Giants are currently on a win streak of seven games, and are just coming off of a Regional Championship win against New Palestine. ... The Giants are led by Ohio State football commit Dawand Jones, and Jalen Windham, a Georgia State basketball commit. ... Jones averages 18.2 points per game while also grabbing 9.2 rebounds per game. ... The Giants will play Trayce Jackson-Davis and the Center Grove Trojans on Saturday, March 16, at 6 p.m.

**CENTER GROVE TROJANS (21-8):** Center Grove is seeking its first Semi-state Championship and its first State Championship. ... The Trojans play the Ben Davis Giants in the Semi-state round of the Class 4-A State Tournament. ... The Trojans are led by McDonald's All-American and Indiana University commit Trayce Jackson-Davis, a 6-foot-11 center. ... Jackson-David had 40 points in the Regional Championship Game against Bloomington North. ... Spencer Piercefield and Justin DeGraaf are two shooters that surround Trayce, and together they make a deadly three-headed monster.

## **RHODES REACHES 600-WIN PLATEAU**

Penn High School Boys Basketball Head Coach Al Rhodes became the 14<sup>th</sup> coach in Indiana High School Boys Basketball history to reach the 600-victory plateau, as the Kingsmen defeated South Bend Washington, 71-56, on Thursday, December 13, 2018.

Rhodes has coached 37 seasons overall, including 11 seasons at Penn.

Rhodes has the fifth-most career wins among active coaches in Indiana High School Boys Basketball. He was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010.

A graduate of Penn High School, Coach Rhodes played collegiately at Tri-State University (now known as Trine University).

Rhodes has been the head coach at four schools – Warsaw, Fort Wayne Northrop, Logansport and Penn. His Warsaw team won the 1984 State Championship.

Rhodes has coached two players who won the Mr. Basketball Award in Indiana, Jeff Grose (1985) and Kevin Ault (1996), both of Warsaw.

Rick Fox, a former high school All-American who was a three-time NBA Champion, played for Rhodes at Warsaw. Fox was also a star player collegiately for the North

Carolina Tar Heels. Rhodes has coached 20 Division I players and seven Indiana All-Stars.

## **APPLEGATE BECOMES PENN'S ALL-TIME LEADING SCORER**

Noah Applegate became Penn's All-Time Boys Basketball Career Scoring Leader, breaking a 55-year old standard, and the Kingsmen overpowered Goshen, 80-57, in high school action on Saturday, Jan. 26, 2019. The Kingsmen senior scored 20 points in the victory.

Applegate, a 6-foot-6 Hillsdale commit, surpassed the previous mark of 1,433 points set by Keith Berkey (1960-1964). Applegate currently has 1,702 points. He is the eighth player in Penn history to score 500 or more points in season. Applegate has 548 points this season.

## **APPLEGATE, LUTZ ON INDY STAR WATCH LIST**

Penn's Noah Applegate and Drew Lutz have been named to the Indianapolis Star's Indiana All-Star Watch List.

Applegate, a 6-foot-6 Senior runner, averages 20.3 points a game and 8.4 rebounds a game. He has 44 assists, 20 blocked shots and 35 steals. Applegate is Penn's All-Time Leading, currently at 1,702 points for his career; He is a Hillsdale College commit.

Lutz is a 6-foot-2 Senior point guard. Lutz averages 18.8 points a game and averages 7.5 assists & 2.5 steals a game. He has 1,062 career points. Lutz is a Bethel College commit.

## **LUTZ HITS 1,000-POINT MARK**

Penn point guard Drew Lutz became just the seventh member of the Penn Basketball Program's 1,000-point club in the LaPorte Sectional Semi-final Game on Friday, March 1, 2019.

Lutz currently has 1,062 points. The 6-foot-1 point guard is a Bethel College commit.

The Kingsmen are currently ranked No. 9 in the state, and have their eyes on the first Boys Basketball State Championship in school history.

Lutz is a four-year varsity letterman and has vastly improved every season.

As a Junior, Lutz averaged nearly 16 points and was named Second-Team All-Northern Indiana Conference and Second-Team All-Area for the Elkhart Truth.

## **PENN BOASTS TWO 1,000/500 POINT SCORERS**

The Penn Boys Basketball Team boasts two 1,000-point career scorers on the same team – a Program first.

Noah Applegate, Penn's All-Time Leading Scorer (1,702 points), reached the 1,000-point mark last season.

Both Applegate and Lutz have scored more than 500 points in one season, the eighth and ninth players to do so in Penn Boys Basketball history.

Applegate has 548 points this season, and Lutz has 507 points this season.

## **KINGSMEN HIT 20-WIN MARK**

Penn has achieved a 20-win season for the 12<sup>th</sup> time in program history, which started with the 1958-59 season.

## **PENN EARNS SHARE OF NIC CHAMPIONSHIP**

Penn finished the Northern Indiana Conference season with an 11-1 record and shared the NIC Championship with South Bend Riley and Marian, who were also 11-1 in league play.

Penn's NIC Championship is the 14<sup>th</sup> in Program history and its first since 2014.

## **APPLEGATE COMMITS TO HILLSDALE**

Noah Applegate's tremendous skill set has helped power Penn's Basketball Program for four seasons. When his prolific high school career is finished, Applegate will take his talents to Hillsdale College.

"Academics played a huge role in my decision to attend Hillsdale," said Applegate, a 6-foot-6 runner who is Penn's All-Time leading scorer. "I had to think about where I could go that would set me up for where I want to be in the future."

Hillsdale is renowned for its academic programs. However, academics isn't the only area where excellence is expected at Hillsdale. The basketball team found a good amount of success last season in particular. The team had an impressive overall record of 21-10.

"I'm really excited to join a successful basketball program and I'm definitely looking forward to helping continue the success," Applegate said. "I think I'm really going to like the team that I'll be a part of."

Applegate, a rare four-year starter at Penn, was named to the Indiana Junior All-Star Team after averaging 20.4 points and 6.8 rebounds a game last season. He dished out 65 assists last season and connected on 50 percent of his shots. Applegate blocked 27 shots and had 27 steals.

"The coaches here at Penn have helped me tremendously with my game," Applegate said. "They've showed me the right way to do things and they have helped me improve every year I've been here. Another important part of my time here has been my connection with my teammates. They have helped me enjoy every minute of my Penn experience."

## **HOLY CROSS NEXT STOP FOR LUDWICK**

Penn basketball star Beau Ludwick, a 6-foot-2 Wing, committed to further his academic and basketball careers at Holy Cross College.

“I chose Holy Cross because I liked the team and also because of the Notre Dame aspect of things – having the small college feel, but also having that big school right across the street. It felt like home and it felt right.”

Ludwick stepped up his game dramatically last season thanks to his hardworking mindset and trying to improve his game each and every day.

“Penn basketball has helped me learn how to become a hardworking person and to never settle for anything, not just in basketball, but in life as well,” Ludwick said. “It has also taught me a lot of life lessons that I can take into the real world.”

Penn basketball Coach Al Rhodes thinks very highly of Ludwick.

“Beau is a tremendously well-rounded player he has always been an excellent defensive player, and this year he has been a great offensive and defensive player as well,” Rhodes said. “I think he's an excellent fit and will have a great career at Holy Cross.”

## **LUTZ TO PLAY COLLEGIATELY AT BETHEL**

Penn starting Point Guard Drew Lutz, a 6-foot-1 Senior, is a main reason the Penn Basketball team has had success in the past couple years.

Along with his success during high school, he had great success over the summer, averaging 25.6 points a game for the MBA Select.

One of the main things Lutz said that he worked on to help his team out the most was creating more space to get his shot off, and also finishing through contact at the rim.

“A big thing for me this summer was being a lot more vocal to my teammates, which I think makes us better,” Lutz said. “I chose Bethel because of the culture of the program,” Lutz said. “In looking at other schools, a big thing for me was making sure the team had the right culture. Also, I've known Coach Lightfoot for a very long time, and he trained me when I was younger so we are very close.”

Lutz said that the Penn Boys Basketball Program has been essential in developing him as a player and a person.

“Coach Rhodes has taught me how to pursue excellence and has been a huge part in helping me with my recruiting process,” Lutz said.

## **HOSKINS CHOOSES BASEBALL**

Kingsmen flamethrower Kegan Hoskins, who starts for the Penn Basketball Team, will pitch at the collegiate level for Kankakee Community College.

"I chose Kankakee because I felt like it was a good fit for me," Hoskins said. "I want to develop more before I move on to the D-I level."

Last season, Hoskins was 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA. He picked up a save in Penn's march to a Sectional Championship. Hoskins had a .333 batting average last season.

"Penn baseball taught me to be disciplined and to always work hard in the weight room and on the field," Hoskins said.

Hoskins is a two-sport athlete, starring in Baseball and Basketball.

"Kegan brings a lot of athletic ability to the table," Penn Baseball Head Coach Greg Dikos said. "He can run, throw, and hit."

## **ROAD WARRIORS**

Penn boasts an 11-1 record on the road this season, and that includes two special road victories for the Kingsmen, at Plymouth and at Merrillville.

The Kingsmen beat Plymouth 79-67, on Saturday, Feb. 16. It was Penn's first victory at Plymouth since 1999 (which includes break in the series from 2000-2001 to 2010-2011).

Penn beat Merrillville, 78-65, on Friday, Feb. 22. It was Penn's first win at Merrillville since 2001, and only the third in the series, which Merrillville leads 11-3.

Seven of Penn's last nine games were on the road, with Penn winning all seven. The only road loss this season was at Elkhart's Northside Gym on Dec. 22, vs. Elkhart Memorial.

## **KINGSMEN FIREPOWER**
