The Penn (27-2) vs. Northwestern (28-0) winner plays the Lawrence North (24-4) vs. Bedford North Lawrence (21-5) winner in the Class 4-A State Championship Game, scheduled for 8:15 p.m. ET on Saturday, Feb. 29, 2020. ... Northwestern won State Championships in 2018 and 2019 in Class 3-A. ... Penn won a Class 4-A State Championship in 2016. ... Northwestern's Madison Layden, a 6-foot-1 Purdue commit, averages 25.7 points, 6.5 assists, 4.0 rebounds and 5.5 steals a game. ... Kendall Bostic, a 6-1 Michigan State commit, averages 20.4 points, 10.0 rebounds and 1.9 blocks a game. ... Penn has won three Semi-state Championships (2011, 2014 and 2016). ... Northwestern has won two Semi-state Championships (2018 and 2019).

Coach Kristi Kaniewski Ulrich

Kristi Kaniewski Ulrich graduated from Mishawaka High School and went on to play basketball at Bethel College.

Penn captured the 2016 Class 4-A State Championship under Ulrich's guidance. Penn was state runner-up in 2011 and 2014.

Ulrich is 256-31 in her 11th season as the Kingsmen coach. She is Penn's all-time winningest Girls Basketball coach.

Penn has won one State Championship, three Semi-state Championships, five Regional Championships, nine Sectional Championships and nine Northern Indiana Conference Championships with Ulrich as head coach.

Kingsmen own proud Hoosier Hysteria history

Penn boasts a proud history in the Indiana High School Athletic Association Girls Basketball State Tournament. Kingsmen Head Coach Kristi Kaniewski Ulrich guided Penn to the 2016 Class 4-A State Championship. In addition to one State Championship, Penn boasts three Semi-State Championships, nine Regional Championships and 20 Sectional Championships.

State Championships (1): 2016.

Semi-State Championships (3): 2011, 2014, 2016.

Regional Championships (9): 1989, 1991, 1999, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2016, 2018, 2020.

Sectional Championships (20): 1976, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1995, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2003, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020.

NIC Champions

Penn claimed its third consecutive Northern Indiana Conference Championship with a 12-0 record this season. The Kingsmen finished the 2019-2020 regular season with a 37-game NIC winning streak. Penn owns 15 NIC crowns in Girls Basketball.

Penn has been a dominant force in the NIC for the past six seasons, rolling up a 73-3 record (.961 winning percentage).

20-win season streak

Coach Kristi Kaniewski Ulrich has led Penn to seven consecutive 20-win seasons.

The Kingsmen are 173-19 in the past seven seasons for a winning percentage of .901.

Clinton hits 1,000-point mark for career

Trinity Clinton reached the coveted 1,000-point mark for her career on Thursday, Jan. 23, 2020, during Penn's 54-41 win at South Bend St. Joseph.

Clinton is the fifth Penn Girls Basketball player to reach the 1,000-point mark, and the first Kingsmen Junior to score 1,000 points in Girls Basketball.

Pate hits 1,000-point mark for career

Penn Senior Reganne Pate became the sixth player in Penn Girls Basketball history to reach the 1,000-point mark for her career on Saturday, Feb. 8, 2020, during Penn's 45-44 victory against Warsaw in the Sectional Championship.

Pate hit the 1,000-point mark with a 3-pointer that pulled Penn into a 39-39 tie with Warsaw in the fourth quarter.

Pate leads the state in 3-pointers

Penn's Reganne Pate leads the state with 95 made 3-pointers. Northwestern's Madison Layden is second in the state with 92 made 3-pointers.

Pate finished as the state's top 3-point shooter last season with 100 made 3-pointers.

Morris signs with Indiana Tech

Caroline Morris brings an array of energy to the floor and her teammates. She will take those talents to Indiana Tech next season.

Morris is a multi-sport athlete who has participated in track, powder puff, and basketball. She played a leading role on the Junior Varsity team, and had key moments for Penn's Varsity in the 2018-2019 season. Morris was part of Penn's 25-0 regular-season record in 2018-2019, and Northern Indiana Conference and Sectional Championships.

Penn Girls Basketball Head Coach Kristi Ulrich said that Morris is an impact player for the Kingsmen.

"The energy and determination that Caroline brings to the floor will create so many opportunities for her and her teammates," Ulrich said.

Pate to play for St. Francis

Reganne Pate, who led the state in 3-pointers last season, will take her sharpshooting talents to St. Francis College in Fort Wayne.

Pate, who reached 1,000-point mark in her high school career, said that she chose St. Francis because the education program is highly regarded. She plans on joining the physicians assistant program. On the basketball side, Pate said that she loved the coaches and players at St. Francis. Pate has been a huge presence for the Penn Girls Basketball Program, which was 25-0 in the regular season and won Northern Indiana Conference and Sectional Championships last season.

Penn's big season in 2018-2019 helped the Kingsmen earn selection to the Indiana Hall of Fame Classic this season.

Last season, Pate averaged 12.4 points a game. She set a Penn record with nine 3-pointers in one game.

Penn Girls Basketball Coach Kristi Ulrich said that St. Francis is a good fit for Pate.

"Saint Francis is a good team and environment for the field of study that Reganne wants to be in," Ulrich said. "The team has the people and coaches to make Reganne better."

Shelton commits to Purdue Northwest

Penn Girls Basketball forward Antreese Shelton will continue her academic and athletic careers at Purdue University Northwest.

Last season, Shelton (a 6-foot-2 starting forward) helped the Kingsmen post their first unbeaten regular-season record in Penn Girls Basketball Program history. The Kingsmen were 25-0 in the regular season and won the Northern Indiana Conference Championship. Penn also won a Sectional Championship.

"I chose Purdue Northwest because it felt like it's the right place for me as an athlete due to the people who are already there who will help me develop," Shelton said. "(Purdue Northwest) also has so many options for the types of things I want to study such as sports broadcasting or something in that field."

Shelton averaged 5.7 points, 4.8 rebounds, 1.4 assists, and 1.4 blocks per game last season. In addition, she was a key contributor during the post-season and helped take the team to the Regional final.

"Antreese is a long and athletic forward who runs the floor extremely well," Penn Girls Basketball Head Coach Kristi Ulrich said. "In addition to that, her frame allows her to be a disruptive force on the defensive end of the floor. She is also a great communicator on the court with her teammates. These attributes will allow her to make an impact at the next level for Purdue Northwest."

Shelton said that playing in Coach Ulrich's program has helped prepare her for college basketball.

"Penn helped me learn that nothing is given, and everything is earned on and off the court," Shelton stated.

Penn selected for the Hall of Fame Classic

Penn High's Kingsmen were selected to participate in the prestigious Hall-of-Fame Classic, held at historic New Castle Fieldhouse on Friday, Dec. 27, 2019.

Penn defeated Brownsburg, 43-40 in the afternoon game, and suffered a 49-37 defeat in the Championship Game to Crown Point.

Ulrich tops in the state

Penn coach Kristi Ulrich owns a 256-31 record at Penn in 11 seasons.

Ulrich's winning percentage of .892 is the best among all active High School Girls Basketball Coaches in Indiana.

On the move

Penn won a Sectional Championship last season, but not with the current Warsaw Sectional field.

Last season, Penn competed at the Mishawaka Sectional, which included LaPorte, Mishawaka, South Bend Adams, South Bend Clay, South Bend Riley, South Bend St. Joseph and the Kingsmen. The Kingsmen beat Clay, 88-15, St. Joseph, 56-43, and LaPorte, 55-33, on the way to the Sectional crown.

IHSAA re-alignment for 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 moved Penn to the Warsaw Sectional. The Kingsmen competed with Concord, Elkhart Central, Elkhart Memorial, Goshen, Northridge and Warsaw in 2019-2020 and won the title. When Elkhart Central and Elkhart Memorial merge to form Elkhart High School in 2020-2021, the Sectional field will decrease from seven teams to six.
