Coach Al Rhodes

Al Rhodes graduated from Penn High School and then went on to earn degrees from Tri-State and Indiana University. Rhodes coached at Warsaw, Logansport, and Fort Wayne Northrop before coming back to Penn. Rhodes guided Warsaw to a state championship in 1984. One of the latest additions to his long list of accolades is being inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. Coach Rhodes owns an overall record of 663-317 in 41 seasons overall and 209-125 in 14 seasons at Penn. Rhodes is the fourth winningest current coach in the state of Indiana.

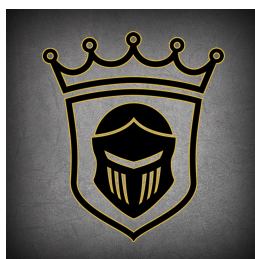

Penn vs. Concord

Penn leads the series 56-27. Penn's 56 victories vs. Concord are the most in the Kingsmen program against any opponent. ... Penn averages 71.8 points a game this season and allows 53.6 points a game. Concord averages 51.7 points a game and allows 51.4. ... Penn Junior Point Guard Markus Burton scored 30 points to pace the Kingsmen to a 58-40 victory against Concord on Friday, Dec. 10, 2022. Burton's scoring production included a pair of 3-pointers and 8-of-8 free throws. The All-State Candidate also battled for seven rebounds and dished out five assists. Joe Smith scored 14 points for the Kingsmen and led the defensive effort by taking two charges. Cole Wojciechowski scored six points and grabbed four rebounds. Jack D'Arcy led Concord vs. Penn with 12 points.

Burton achieves scoring milestones

Penn Junior Markus Burton, a 6-foot-0 Point Guard, is the all-time Penn single-season scoring leader in Boys Basketball with **657 points**, and he is third on the all-time scoring list with **1,287 points**.

- Burton became the eighth player in Penn Boys Basketball history to reach the 1,000-point mark. Burton reached the mark on Friday, Jan. 28, 2022, against South Bend Riley. Burton scored points 999 and 1,000 of his career on a drive and spin move, elevating for a jumper in the lane. He finished with 31 points against Riley. The Kingsmen sprinted past Riley, 76-57, for a Northern Indiana Conference victory.
- Burton currently has **1,287 points in his career**, ranking him third on the all-time scoring list. Noah Applegate (2015-2019) is the all-time scoring leader with 1,702 points, followed by Keith Berkey (1960-1964) with 1,413 points.
- Burton became the 10th player to reach the 500-point mark. He currently has **657 points this season** and ranks **first on the all-time list**. Rod Creech (1987) was the previous Penn Boys Basketball record-holder for most points in a season with 642 points.

Penn earns share of NIC Championship

Penn claimed a share of the Northern Indiana Conference Championship with a 10-1 league record this season. The Kingsmen share the NIC title with Glenn and Marian. Penn owns 15 NIC titles in Boys Basketball, the previous crown coming in 2019.

Notable

Penn posted an 11-0 record at home this season, tying a program record. ... The last time Penn posted an unbeaten record at home was a 9-0 mark in the 2013-2014 season. ... The program record of an 11-0 home mark was set in the 1995-1996 season. ... Penn has been unbeaten at home in six of its 64 seasons. ... Penn averages 71.8 points a game this season (tops in the Northern Indiana Conference). ... Last season Penn averaged 56.0 points a game. ... The Kingsmen scored a program record 104 points in a 104-33 win at New Prairie (12.7.2021). ... Penn stunned No. 1-ranked (Class 3-A) Glenn, 78-53, at Glenn (2.3.2022). ... Penn has outscored its opponents 395 (17.2 a game)-274 (11.9 a game) in points off of turnovers this season. ... Penn has 87 blocked shots (24 games) this season compared to 37 (in 24 games) last season.

Sectional history lesson

The Penn Kingsmen own 16 Sectional crowns in Boys Basketball. Penn's last Sectional Championship was in 2019, when the Kingsmen hosted the Sectional. Penn's last Sectional Championship at Elkhart's historic Northside Gym was in 2007.
