"The way Coach Dikos does things helped me tremendously, pushing me to work harder," Hums said. "Also, in the family culture, all of my teammates supported me and helped me throughout the process."

Teammate Kydin Horvath said that Hums has the tools to excel in college baseball.

"Cooper has great agility," Horvath said. "He's really fast and that will really help him get around on the bases. He's good at reading baseballs and tracking down the baseball. He covers a lot of ground in a short period of time."


