Game Notes

Cathedral leads the series 3-0. ... The Fighting Irish beat Penn 35-21 last season at Penn. ... This contest is the end of the series between the Kingsmen and the Fighting Irish. ... The Penn-Cathedral match-up features two of the state's top quarterbacks. ... Cathedral's Danny O'Neil is a Colorado commit. ... He is 30-50-2 passing for 487 yards and 5 TDs. ... O'Neil averages 6.4 yards a carry rushing, gaining 108 yards on 17 carries. ... Penn's Nolan McCullough is 15-28-2 passing for 222 yards and 1 TD. ... McCullough averages 12.1 yards a carry rushing, gaining 302 yards on 25 carries. ... Running back Jake Balis has gained 206 yards on 30 carries (6.9 ave.). ... Penn cornerback Vincent Horner has three interceptions this season, including a 64-yard Pick-6 vs. Mishawaka.

Penn coach Cory Yeoman

Penn head coach Cory Yeoman has a 200-54 record, taking over the Kingsmen Program in 2003.

Yeoman has guided Penn to semistate titles in 2017, 2015, 2011, and 2003. The Kingsmen have won nine regional crowns under Yeoman's guidance, 12 sectional titles and 17 Northern Indiana Conference championships.

Coach Yeoman played at Penn High School, earning all-state honors at defensive tackle. In 1979, Coach Yeoman led a Kingsmen defense that only allowed 33 yards rushing a game. He graduated from Penn in 1980. Coach Yeoman is in the Indiana Football Hall of Fame, the first Penn player nominated for the Hall.

After his playing career at Penn, coach Yeoman played for Miami (Ohio) University. He joined the Kingsmen coaching staff after graduation from Miami.

DUAL THREAT

Penn Senior Quarterback Nolan McCullough (6-3, 198) has been a dual threat for the Kingsmen this season.

McCullough boasts 524 yards of total offense with 222 yards passing and 302 yards rushing. He is 15-28-2 passing for 222 yards and 1 TD. Running the ball, McCullough averages 12.1 yards a carry rushing, gaining 302 yards on 25 carries.

MAN OF STEAL

Penn cornerback Vincent Horner has played Grand Theft Football this season.

Horner has three interceptions through two games.

The Kingsmen Senior picked off a pass in Penn's 38-21 victory against No. 1 (Class 5-A) Valparaiso on Aug. 18.

Against No. 7 (Class 5-A) Mishawaka, Horner intercepted two passes, including a 64-yard Pick-6.

EARLY TESTS

Penn is facing its third consecutive ranked opponent when the Kingsmen travel to Indianapolis to take on perennial state powerhouse Cathedral.

The Fighting Irish are ranked No. 7 in Class 6-A.

Penn played No. 1 (Class 5-A) Valparaiso in the season opener, and then took on No. 7 (Class 5-A) Mishawaka last week in the second game of the season.

Penn is ranked No. 8 this week in Class 6-A.

CHAMPIONSHIP LEGACIES

Cathedral and Penn own two of Indiana's proudest legacies in high school football.

Cathedral owns 14 State Championships in Football. The Fighting Irish last state title was in 2021 in Class 5-A.

Penn owns five State Championships in Football. The Kingsmen hoisted a state championship trophy last in 2000.

KINGSMEN CONNECTION

Cathedral quarterback Danny O'Neil is the son of former Penn Football/Wrestling standout Mike O'Neil.

SECOND-HALF SURGE

Penn has outscored its opponents 40-7 in the second half through its first two games of the season.

Penn trailed Valparaiso 14-12 at halftime in the season opener, but outscored the Vikings 26-7 in the second half.

Penn trailed Mishawaka 7-0 in the second game of the season, but fought back for a 14-7 halftime lead. The Kingsmen outscored Mishawaka 14-0 in the second half.

COLTS H.S. COACH OF THE WEEK/200 CAREER VICTORIES

Last Friday (August 25, 2023) night's big Kingsmen win over the Mishawaka Cavemen also gave Penn Football Coach Cory Yeoman his 200th career win – making him Penn High School's second football coach to earn 200 wins. Penn is now the ONLY high school in Indiana to have two coaches meet this milestone. The first was longtime legendary Kingsmen Coach Chris Geesman (309 wins), who Coach Yeoman played under and coached with at the beginning of his career at Penn.

So it was only fitting that Hall of Famer Coach Geesman be on hand on Wednesday, Aug. 30, when the Indianapolis Colts presented Coach Yeoman with the award for Colts/NFL Coach of the Week for Week 2, presented by Corteva Agriscience, headquartered in Indianapolis. Former NFL player and current Youth Football Commissioner for the Colts, Mike Prior, presented Coach Yeoman with the award and a \$2,000 check that will go to Penn Athletic Department. Prior gave Coach Yeoman his award and check in Penn High School's Strength & Conditioning Weight Room with Penn's senior football players applauding him.

The student-athletes got a chance to hear from Prior who talked about his commitment and dedication through challenges in high school and college football, his choice to play pro football over baseball, and how it eventually paid off. Prior played for Tampa Bay Buccaneers, the Colts and the Green Bay Packers. For the Packers, he was a punt returner and a defensive back. He played in Super Bowl XXXII and XXXII. Prior showed the players one of his Super Bowl Championship rings and they had a chance to ask him questions.

On an interesting note, Prior is an assistant football coach at Cathedral High School, who Penn plays this Friday, Sept. 1, in Indianapolis. Coach Yeoman joked and asked Prior if he "wishes every team good luck this week?" Prior said that "Yes, he does!

Penn High's Football team stormed back in the second half to punch Class 5-A No. 1 and defending state champion Valparaiso, 38-21, in the 2023 season opener on Friday, Aug. 20.

Valparaiso led the visiting Kingsmen 14-12 at halftime.

Penn re-focused and battled back in the second half, outscoring Valparaiso 26-7.

Quarterback Nolan McCullough scored three touchdowns on runs of 30, 80 and 15 yards. He gained 187 yards on 15 carries.

McCullough was also 8-12-1 passing for 215 yards.

Jake Balis scored on TD runs of 80, five and seven yards. Balis gained 114 yards on 15 carries.

Ryan O'Connell and Vincent Horner each picked off passes in the second half for the Kingsmen. Horner sprinted for a 24-yard return, and O'Connell returned his pick three yards.

Camden Anderson turned in a thrilling 38-yard punt return for Penn.

Game 2: Aug. 25, 2023 PENN 28, Mishawaka 7 At Everwise Freed Field, Penn High School

Penn football celebrating the return of the fabled "Backyard Brawl" with a dominating performance as the Kingsmen overpowered Mishawaka, 28-7.

Penn (2-0) entered the battle ranked No. 9 in Class 6-A. Mishawaka (1-1) was ranked No. 7 in Class 5-A.

The victory gives the Kingsmen a 49-15-1 lead in the intense neighborhood rivalry. The series was on pause since 2019 due to scheduling issues as Mishawaka transitioned to the Northern Lakes Conference from the Northern Indiana Conference.

Mishawaka scored on its first possession, and then the Kingsmen reeled off 28 unanswered points.

Kingsmen quarterback Nolan McCullough sprinted for 92 yards rushing on 10 carries, including a 54-yard TD run. He was 6-15-1 passing for 65 yards, including a 5-yard TD strike to Elijah Coker.

Jake Balis rushed for 80 yards on 15 carries, and scored an eight-yard TD.

Vincent Horner highlighted the Kingsmen defensive effort with two interceptions, returning one of his picks for a 64-yard touchdown.

Tommy Powlus made eight tackles, and Jackson Griffith and Brandon Lynch made seven tackles each.
