### Game notes

The Elkhart Sectional winner plays the Chesterton Sectional winner (Chesterton vs. Crown Point) in the Regional (TBA) on Saturday, March 9. ... Penn has won the last two Sectional titles (18 overall) and will be making its fourth consecutive Sectional title Game appearance. ... Warsaw has won 40 Sectional Championships, the last in 2017. ... Warsaw defeated Penn 56-53, in overtime, at Penn on Tuesday, Jan. 9. ... Dominic Bonner led Penn with 19 points in the Jan. 9 meeting, including 17 in the second half. ... Luke Bricker led Warsaw with 18 points. ... Penn has won nine of its last 11 games. ... Warsaw has won six games in a row, and 10 of its last 12 games. ... The Tigers shot 66 percent (18-of-27) in their semi-final victory against Concord, including 7-of-14 three-pointers. ... After spotting Elkhart a 7-0 lead, Penn outscored Elkhart 52-36 in its semifinal victory.

### Head Coach Barak Coolman

Barak Coolman is in his first season as the head coach of the Penn Kingsmen. He has a 271-123 record overall. Prior to taking the Penn head coaching job, Coolman guided Valparaiso to 151 victories, three Class 4-A Sectional titles and four Duneland Conference titles. Coolman's teams at Fort Wayne Northrop won 102 games, won three Class 4-A Sectional crowns, and won three Summit Athletic Conference tournament titles. Coolman graduated from Bethel University in 2000, and earned a Master of Arts Degree from Ball State University in 2006. He graduated from Leo High School in 1996. Coolman played on two NAIA National Championship Basketball teams at Bethel.

## **Familiar territory**

Penn will be playing in a Sectional Championship game for the fourth season in a row and for the fifth time in six seasons when the Kingsmen take the court at Northside Gym to contend for the 2024 Sectional crown.

The Kingsmen won Sectional Championships in 2023, 2022 and 2019. Penn was Sectional runner-up in 2021.

## **Stepping it up**

Penn has connected on 77 percent of its free throws (23-of-30) in the Sectional, including a perfect 6-of-6 in a fourth-quarter comeback against Northridge in the Sectional opener. During the regular-season, the Kingsmen hit 67 percent of their free throws.

## **Kingsmen thrive despite limited Varsity experience**

Penn is producing an outstanding 2023-2024 season in coach Barak Coolman's first season.

Coolman has guided the Kingsmen to 17 victories despite taking over a team with limited Varsity experience from last season.

The Kingsmen returned no starters from the 2022-2023 team that rolled up a 28-2 record and earned Regional, Sectional and Northern Indiana Conference Championships. The starting line-up featured Indiana Mr. Basketball Markus Burton (Notre Dame), Dylan Derda (Judson), Joey Garwood (Concordia), Josh Gatete (Air Force Academy), Joe Smith (DePauw). Penn led the state in scoring last season, averaging 77.9 points a game.

This season's Penn Kingsmen returned only 378 points from last season, just 16 percent of the 2,337 points scored in 2023-2024.

The Kingsmen returned only 1,162 minutes of experience from last season, which is 24.2 percent.

Of the six current Penn players who were on the roster in 2022-2023, there was only one game started among them, that by Trey Miller.

## **Comeback kids**

Penn has won 10 games in which the Kingsmen trailed at halftime or the end of the third quarter.

## **Lockdown defense**

Penn's defense has been relentless this season. The Kingsmen are ranked No. 38 in the state, allowing only 45.2 points a game. In the Sectional, Penn is allowing 38.5 points a game.

Penn limits opponents to 39.8 percent field-goal shooting. The Kingsmen perimeter defense holds opponents to 30.2 percent for 3-point shooting.

The Kingsmen boast 163 steals (6.8 a game).

## **Making the Grade**

The Penn Boys Basketball Team boasts seven members who have earned Academic Achievement status.

Students earn the Academic Achievement Award for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.5 or better over four or six semesters, without receiving a D or an F.

Kingsmen Boys Basketball players John Bedient, Dominic Bonner, Casey Finn, Ethan Good, Nolan McCullough, Trey Miller and Carter Utz received the high academic honor.

## **Brown displays many talents for Kingsmen**

Penn Wing Maverick Brown has been a force for the Kingsmen in a number of different categories.

Brown, a 6-foot-1 Senior, leads Penn in scoring (11.5 points a game), rebounding (7.5 a game), steals (41) and is second on the team in assists (66).

## **Multiple-sport Athletes power Penn**

Penn's frequently used starting line-up features four multiple-sport athletes.

Dominic Bonner (Football/Basketball), Maverick Brown (Football/Basketball), Casey Finn (Basketball/Baseball) and Nolan McCullough (Football/Basketball/Track) have been part of Championship efforts in each of their sports.

Other multiple-sport athletes on the Kingsmen Basketball roster include Tommy Harringer (Basketball/Baseball), Carter Utz (Soccer/Basketball) and Kellen Watson (Football/Basketball/Track).

## **Passing leads to success**

Penn's passing this season has fueled the Kingsmen success this season.

The Kingsmen have dished out 364 assists this season, compared to 162 by opponents. That gives the Kingsmen an average of 15.3 assists a game compared to 6.5 assists a game by opponents.

## **Hitting the boards key for Kingsmen**

Penn's success in racking up 18 victories in the regular season has been helped by the Kingsmen attack-mentality in rebounding.

Penn has outrebounded opponents 744-555, averaging 31.0 rebounds a game while limiting opponents to 23.1 rebounds a game.

The Kingsmen hold an advantage on the offensive boards, averaging 12.3 offensive rebounds a game to 9.0 for opponents. That has led the Kingsmen to a 207-130 advantage in second-chance points.

In Penn's 18 victories, the Kingsmen average 33.0 rebounds a game. In Penn's six losses, the Kingsmen average 25.0 rebounds a game.

## **Bright Future**

Penn's Junior Varsity Team finished with a 20-2 record this season. The Kingsmen ended the season on a 19-game winning streak.

JV Players Christian Bonner, Colden Hernandez, Lucas Obermeyer and MaKale Price were promoted to the Varsity for the Sectional.

## **Bench strength**

Penn packs plenty of firepower off the bench this season.

The Kingsmen bench has outscored opponents 313 points to 131 -- 13.0 points a game to 5.5 points a game.

## **Sagarin ratings**

Penn is ranked No. 1 in the Sagarin ratings among Elkhart Sectional schools, but fewer than 2.0 separates the top four teams. Penn is at 81.06, followed by Warsaw 80.22, Northridge 80.17 and Concord 79.69. Penn is No. 1 in the sectional for Strength of Schedule. Northridge, Concord and Warsaw are ahead of Penn for most recent performance.

## **Historic venue**

Penn competes in a sectional played at one of Indiana's historic venues -- Northside Gym in Elkhart. The Gym, constructed in 1954, is located in Northside Middle School.

Northside Gym seats 7,373 fans. Before its renovation, Northside Gym seated 8,200 fans, which made it the largest high school gym in the nation.

Currently, Northside Gym is the seventh largest gym in the nation. Indiana has 10 of the 12 largest high school gyms in the nation. The nation's largest high school gym is the New Castle Fieldhouse, located in New Castle, Indiana -- 8,424.



## **Taylor Football next stop for Brown**

Two-sport Kingsmen athlete Maverick Brown committed to Taylor University to continue his academic and football career.

Brown (6-foot-1, 205) started at linebacker for the Kingsmen Football Team and helped lead the Kingsmen to Sectional and Northern Indiana Conference Championships.

Brown made 46 tackles and contributed 17 assists. Brown also had three impressive defensive touchdowns.

When he's not terrorizing on the football field, Brown also does it on the basketball court, starting for the Kingsmen and leading the team in scoring, steals and rebounding.

Coach Cory Yeoman thinks Brown is a great teammate and senior leader.

"Maverick is an ultra competitor ... and wants to be the very best he can be," Yeoman said. "He is a heck of a teammate, raising others up around him. He would be a great guy to play with. I know he was an outstanding guy to coach."

Coach Yeoman expects Brown to make an immediate impact at Taylor.

"Maverick has a great understanding and vision of what is going on around him," Yeoman said. "He sees the game extremely well. Being a two-sport athlete has a lot to do with that, he is a great basketball player. He has the traits of basketball player that show up in football."

## **Finn commits to Adrian for Baseball**

Casey Finn has chosen to take his Academic and Athletic abilities to Adrian College to further his baseball career.

"I really liked the team energy and culture that was portrayed as I went on my first visit," Finn said. "I also believe the coaching staff at Adrian can help me develop into a better player."

During the 2023 season, Finn played an important role as the Kingsmen captured their second straight state title.

As a right-handed Designated Hitter and First Baseman, Finn had a .317 batting average (.304 with runners in scoring position), a .397 slugging percentage. Finn lined five doubles, nine RBIs, and scored 24 runs.

"Being a part of the Penn Baseball program has shown me what it takes to be a winner," Finn said. "As a team, you must play catch, throw strikes, and put the ball in play if you want to come out on top."

"Casey has speed and is a very good base-runner," Kingsmen teammate Emerson Cowham said. "He puts the ball in play in key situations. Just like in the Hamilton Southeastern game, he showcased his speed and ability to put the ball in play. That led to our game-winning rally. He's a smooth infielder as well. He can get rid of the ball quickly."

## McCullough commits to Dayton for Football

Penn's star quarterback, Senior Nolan McCullough, is continuing his academic and athletic career at the University of Dayton. McCullough led the Penn Kingsmen to Sectional and Northern Indiana Conference championships, and was named the MVP of the Northern Indiana Conference. There was no shortage of firepower in McCullough's film for this past season.

After going through the recruiting process, McCullough knew Dayton was the place he wanted to spend his next four years the moment he stepped on campus.

"What led to me choosing Dayton included the high level of football I'd get to play, the overall return on investment, the campus life, and above all, the brotherhood I'd be a part of," McCullough said.

McCullough knows that being the starting quarterback for Penn High School for two years is no easy task and that it has greatly prepared him for the next level.

"Penn football has prepared me for the next level because of the life lessons I have learned throughout my career, as well as the high level of competition that comes with being a Penn Kingsman," McCullough said.

Kingsmen teammate Auden Jones said that McCullough has the drive to be successful.

"Nolan has a skill that very few players have," Jones said. "He has an endless motor that pushes him to want to be better in every single way he can. His hard work ethic is unmatched and is something that everyone he's around aspires to achieve."
