## Game Notes

Penn leads the series vs. Lake Central 5-0. ... Four of Lake Central's losses have been by a touchdown or less. ... Penn and Lake Central have one common opponent – Valparaiso. ... The Kingsmen defeated Valparaiso 49-42 in the season opener. ... Lake Central lost to Valparaiso 21-14 on Oct. 18. ... Penn has won six of its last seven games. ... Lake Central has lost its last three games. ... The Indians have scored 163 points this season and allowed 193. ... Penn has scored 262 points this season and allowed 117. ... Lake Central is 1-4 in road games. ... Penn is 4-1 at home this season. ... Lake Central's Tyler Becich has 106 tackles this season and Brody Ramirez has made 103 tackles. ... After giving up 76 points combined in its first two games (38.0 points a game), the Penn defense has allowed 48 points in its last seven games (6.9 points a game).

## Penn coach Pete Riordan

Pete Riordan was named the seventh head coach of the Kingsmen Football Program in March of 2024.

He was an assistant coach on the Kingsmen Football staff for 20 years (most recently serving as Defensive Coordinator).

Riordan has coached in four State Championship Football games as an assistant with the Kingsmen (2003, 2011, 2015 and 2017).

Riordan owns a state championship legacy. He played on the 1995 South Bend St. Joseph State Championship Football Team and was a three-year starter. He earned a B.A. from Wabash and earned an MBA in Finance from Indiana University South Bend.

## **NEXT ROUND**

The winner of the Penn (7-2) vs. Lake Central (3-6) game plays the winner of the Crown Point (9-0) vs. Portage (4-5) game in the Sectional Championship on Friday, Nov. 8.

If Penn wins and Crown Point defeats Portage, Penn would host Crown Point in the Sectional Championship. If Penn wins and Portage defeats Crown Point, Penn would travel to Portage for the Sectional Championship game.

The Sectional 1 Champion would take on the Sectional 2 Champion in the Regional. Sectional 2 includes Carroll, Elkhart, Fort Wayne Northrop and Fort Wayne Snider.

## **HOISTING THE HARDWARE**

Penn boasts 26 Sectional Championships in Football. The Kingsmen claimed the Sectional 2 Championship last season. Lake Central owns five Sectional Championships, the last one coming in 2013.

Sectional 1 has two Sectional Championship from last season. Crown Point won the Sectional 1 title in 2023, and Penn won the 2023 title in Sectional 2. Realignment put the Kingsmen in Sectional 1.

Crown Point has eight Sectional Championships in Football. The Bulldogs defeated Penn 34-33 in the Regional last season. Portage has eight Sectional Championships, the last one coming in 2003.

## **TRIPLE THREAT**

Penn Senior Quarterback Kellen Watson joined the 1,000-yard club this season. Watson has gained 570 yards rushing and has passed for 594 yards, giving him 1,164 yards total offense. Watson has thrown for 10 touchdowns and scored seven touchdowns running the ball.

Watson isn't just a dual-threat. He is a triple-threat talent, also attracting plenty of Power 4 Division I attention as a wide receiver, the position he played last season.

## **FAMILY BUSINESS**

Taking the ball away from enemy offenses is the Horner Family Business.

Payton Horner, a Senior Defensive Back for the Kingsmen Varsity, has intercepted five passes this season. He is tied for the league lead for interceptions in the Northern Indiana Conference.

Payton's brother Ethan Horner, a Freshman, intercepted four passes and recovered four fumbles in eight Freshmen games. He also returned a punt for a touchdown.

Vince Horner, the older brother of Payton and Ethan Horner, intercepted six passes last season – three of which were Pick-6's.

## **BALANCED OFFENSE**

Penn's balanced offensive attack features three players with seven or more touchdowns.

Running back Jaedon Parker has scored nine touchdowns to lead the Kingsmen.

Quarterback Kellen Watson and wide receiver Tayshon Bardo have scored seven touchdowns each this season.

## **KICKING PRECISION**

Kingsmen punter Dylan DeDario has landed punts inside the 20-yard line 10 times this season, and has pinned opposing teams inside the 10-yard line eight times. He is averaging 39.5 yards a punt. His longest punt is 63 yards against Mishawaka, and also had a 59-yard punt against Marian and a 55-yard punt against New Prairie.

DeDario is a perfect 29-of-29 in extra-point kicks, and he has five field goals and 11 touchbacks.

## **COMEBACK PLAYER**

Penn defensive end Quinn Watson has been an impact player for the Kingsmen coming off of two knee surgeries.

A Junior who is the brother of Penn quarterback Kellen Watson, Quinn has 36 tackles, including leading the Kingsmen with six quarterback sacks and 10 tackles for loss. He has also forced a fumble and 10 QB pressures.

## **STEPPING IN AND STEPPING UP**

Jaedon Parker was switched from wide receiver to running back due to injuries early in the season to two Kingsmen running backs. Parker responded to getting his number called as a running back. In seven games at his new position, Parker is averaging 6.2 yards a carry. He has gained 533 yards and scored seven touchdowns.

Parker has six receptions for 79 yards, an average of 13.2 yards a catch. He has two receiving touchdowns.

## **CHAMPIONSHIP LEGACY**

Penn head coach Pete Riordan and South Bend St. Joseph head coach Ben Downey were teammates on the 1995 State Championship St. Joseph Football Team.

Riordan and Downey were on opposite sidelines on Oct. 18, when Riordan's Kingsmen took on Downey's Huskies. Riordan coached Penn to a 27-0 victory against St. Joseph.
