Penn leads the series vs. Crown Point 3-1. ... Penn and Crown Point were each Sectional Champions in 2023. ... Penn won the Sectional 2 crown, and Crown Point was the champion of Sectional 1. ... Crown Point defeated Penn, 34-33, in the 2023 Regional at Penn. ... Penn boasts 26 Sectional Championships in Football. ... Crown Point has eight Sectional Championships in Football. ... Crown Point averages 42.6 points a game and allows 8.3 points a game. ... Penn scores 29.7 points a game and allows 12.4 points a game. ... Crown Point has had a running clock in all 10 of its games (leading by 35 points or more in the second half). ... Crown Point quarterback Noah Ehrlich, a Miami of Ohio recruit, was 117-of-156 passing (75 percent completion rate) for 1,897 yards, with 24 TDs and one interception in the regular season.

Penn coach Pete Riordan

Pete Riordan was named the seventh head coach of the Kingsmen Football Program in March of 2024.

He was an assistant coach on the Kingsmen Football staff for 20 years (most recently serving as Defensive Coordinator).

Riordan has coached in four State Championship Football games as an assistant with the Kingsmen (2003, 2011, 2015 and 2017).

Riordan owns a state championship legacy. He played on the 1995 South Bend St. Joseph State Championship Football Team and was a three-year starter. He earned a B.A. from Wabash and earned an MBA in Finance from Indiana University South Bend.

NEXT ROUND

The winner of the Sectional 1 Championship game between Penn (8-2) and Crown Point (10-0) game plays the winner of the Sectional 2 Championship game between Fort Wayne Snider (8-2) and Carroll (8-2) in the Regional Championship on Friday, Nov. 15.

If Penn and Carroll are the Sectional Champions, the game would be at Penn. If Penn and Fort Wayne Snider are the Sectional Champions, Penn would play at Fort Wayne Snider. If Crown Point is the champion in Sectional 1, it would host Snider or Carroll.

TRIPLE THREAT

Penn Senior Quarterback Kellen Watson joined the 1,000-yard club this season. Watson has gained 570 yards rushing and has passed for 594 yards, giving him 1,164 yards total offense. Watson has thrown for 10 touchdowns and scored seven touchdowns running the ball. Watson isn't just a dual-threat. He is a triple-threat talent, also attracting plenty of Power 4 Division I attention as a wide receiver, the position he played last season.

DAZZLING DEBUT

Brody Cashen made his debut as a starting quarterback for the Penn Varsity in the Sectional first-round game against Lake Central. Cashen helped the Kingsmen post a 35-7 victory with 13-of-17 passing for 186 yards and one touchdown. He also ran for a 56-yard TD. This season Cashen is 16-of-25 with a 64 percent completion percentage, 248 yards, and two passing TDs.

FAMILY BUSINESS

Taking the ball away from enemy offenses is the Horner Family Business.

Payton Horner, a Senior Defensive Back for the Kingsmen Varsity, has intercepted five passes this season. He is tied for the league lead for interceptions in the Northern Indiana Conference.

Payton's brother Ethan Horner, a Freshman, intercepted four passes and recovered four fumbles in eight Freshmen games. He also returned a punt for a touchdown.

Vince Horner, the older brother of Payton and Ethan Horner, intercepted six passes last season – three of which were Pick-6's.

BALANCED OFFENSE

Penn's balanced offensive attack features three players with seven or more touchdowns.

Running back Jaedon Parker has scored 11 touchdowns to lead the Kingsmen.

Wide receiver Tayshon Bardo has scored eight touchdowns this season, and quarterback Kellen Watson has scored seven TDs.

CLEARING THE WAY

Penn's offensive line – led by Seniors Gavin McGee (Left Tackle), Aiden Deal (Center) and Brody Brown (Right Tackle). The offensive line has allowed only two sacks this season, while helping the team accumulate a total of 1,964 rushing yards. Penn averages 6.3 yards a carry and is averaging 196.4 yards a game rushing. The Kingsmen have gained 2,806 total yards behind the offensive line.

WILD BUNCH HITS HARD

Penn's Wild Bunch Defense has been a force in 2024. The Penn defense has only allowed 6.8 points a game in its last eight games. Penn boasts 20 sacks, led by Quinn Watson's six sacks. Christian Bonner has four sacks and Kenny Welsh has three sacks. Watson has 12 tackles for loss, Bonner nine, J.T. Seger five and Welsh four.

Payton Horner leads Penn with five interceptions. Joey DePalma has two interceptions, one of them a Pick-6. Jonathan Searfoss also has a Pick-6 for the Kingsmen.

KICKING PRECISION

Kingsmen punter Dylan DeDario has landed punts inside the 20-yard line 11 times this season, and has pinned opposing teams inside the 10-yard line eight times. He is averaging 40.5 yards a punt. His longest punt is 65 yards against Lake Central. He kicked a 63-yard punt against Mishawaka, had a 59-yard punt against Marian and a 55-yard punt against New Prairie.

DeDario is a perfect 38-of-38 in extra-point kicks, and he has five field goals and 16 touchbacks.

COMEBACK PLAYER

Penn defensive end Quinn Watson has been an impact player for the Kingsmen coming off of two knee surgeries.

A Junior who is the brother of Penn quarterback Kellen Watson, Quinn has 36 tackles, including leading the Kingsmen with six quarterback sacks and 12 tackles for loss. He has also forced a fumble and 11 QB pressures.

STEPPING IN AND STEPPING UP

Jaedon Parker was switched from wide receiver to running back due to injuries early in the season to two Kingsmen running backs. Parker responded to getting his number called as a running back. In eight games at his new position, Parker is averaging 6.4 yards a carry. He has gained 579 yards and scored nine touchdowns.

Parker has seven receptions for 95 yards, an average of 13.6 yards a catch. He has two receiving touchdowns.

PENN 49, Valparaiso 42 At Everwise Freed Field, Penn High School

Penn Football opened the 2024 season with a heart-thumping 49-42 victory against Valparaiso in high school football action at Everwise Freed Field on Friday, Aug. 23.

The game was the first for Pete Riordan as the Kingsmen head coach.

Kingsmen quarterback Kellen Watson, a 6-foot-3, 190-pound Senior, rushed for 291 yards. Watson, who finished third in the state in the 100-meter dash last season, sprinted for four touchdowns on runs of 77, 64, 63 and 26 yards.

Watson connected with Junior Tayshon Bardo for TD strikes of 15, 31 and 50 yards.

Junior Defensive End Quinn Watson, Kellen's brother, stuffed Valpo's hopes with a quarterback sack on the final play.

Malachi Evans scored the Kingsmen touchdown on a 1-yard run.

Game 3: Sept. 6, 2024 PENN 35, South Bend Riley 7
At Jackson Field, South Bend

Jaedon Parker scored three touchdowns in his debut as a running back and the Penn Kingsmen opened Northern Indiana Conference play with a 35-7 victory against host South Bend Riley on Friday, Sept. 6, 2024.

Parker switched from receiver to running back this past week. In his first Varsity game as a running back, Parker gained 138 yards on 14 carries. He scored on touchdown runs of 26, 11 and 16 yards.

Cohen Wysong gained 49 yards on 10 carries and scored on an 18-yard run.
