Jaidon Van Pelt averages 116.8 yards a game and Harrison Scheele averages 71.0 yards a game. ... Penn's 1-2 receiver combo of Brayson Hurley and Mason Biernacki average 78.0 and 72.3 yards a game respectively. ... Carroll is No. 9 in the Sagarin ratings with a strength of schedule of 23. ... Penn is No. 10 in the Sagarin ratings and has a strength of schedule of 96.

Penn coach Pete Riordan

HOISTING THE HARDWARE

Penn boasts 18 Regional Championships in Football.

The last Kingsmen Regional crown was in 2017.

Carroll owns one Regional Championship (2022).

Penn has won five State Championships (1983, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000).

Carroll's best showing in the State Tournament is a 2022 state runner-up finish.

HERNANDEZ DOUBLE TROUBLE FOR OPPONENTS

Penn Senior Colden Hernandez (5-foot-11, 179-pound Senior) is one of the top impact players on both sides of the ball in Indiana.

On defense, Hernandez has five interceptions (include two Pick-6's) and has broken up eight passes.

On offense, Hernandez is Penn's leading rusher with eight touchdowns and 376 yards. He averages 6.3 yards a carry.

Hernandez has also been a force on special teams. He has blocked two kicks, and returns punts and kickoffs.

HALL ECLIPSES 2,000-YARD PASSING MARK

Penn quarterback Landon Hall, a 6-4, 203 Junior, has turned the passing pocket into a launching pad for Penn's Gold Rush offense.

The Power 4 college prospect has passed for 2,064 yards despite only playing two quarters or less in most of Penn's games. The Junior is bringing the heat, connecting on 104-of-139 passes for a dazzling 74.8 percent completion percentage. He has fired off 24 touchdown strikes this season and has only been intercepted twice. His quarterback rating is an astronomical 150.

Hall has guided the Kingsmen to an 11-0 record with Sectional and Northern Indiana Conference Championships.

HURLEY CATCHES ON

All-State candidate Brayson Hurley is a prime target in Penn's aerial attack.

A 6-4, 218 Junior, Hurley has hauled in 44 catches for 858 yards and nine touchdowns. His longest touchdown was an 82-yard run after a catch from quarterback Landon Hall. Hurley averages 78.0 receiving yards a game.

Hurley has also contributed to the Kingsmen special teams, averaging 32.67 yards a kickoff. He has one kickoff return for a touchdown (89 yards).

BIERNACKI'S BREAKTHROUGH SEASON

Mason Biernacki, a 6-foot-0, 170-pound Wide Receiver, has turned in a sensational Sophomore season.

Biernacki caught the winning touchdown pass in Penn's 28-24 victory against Crown Point in the Sectional Championship game against Crown Point. He has 39 catches for 795 yards and 11 touchdowns. Biernacki averages 20.4 yards a catch.

As a Freshman, Biernacki was a starting left-fielder for the No. 1-ranked Penn Baseball team. He is considered the No. 2 outfield prospect in Indiana for the Class of 2028.

FOUR-SPORT STAR

Christian Bonner, a 6-1, 240 Senior Defensive Lineman, is a four-sport star for the Kingsmen.

Bonner is one of leaders of Penn's Wild Bunch defense with five tackles for loss, four QB pressures, two quarterback sacks and a pass deflection that led to a Pick-6.

He is also a key player on the Kingsmen Boys Basketball Team.

In the Spring, Bonner competes for the Boys Track & Field Team, and he helped lead the Boys Volleyball Team to a Sectional Championship in its first season.

DEFENSIVE FORCE

Penn's defense has been a dominant force this season.

The Kingsmen boast four Pick-6s – two by Colden Hernandez, and one each by Ethan Horner and John White.

Penn has racked up 25 sacks, led by Quinn Watson with eight sacks.

WATSON'S COMEBACK

Penn defensive end Quinn Watson, a 6-2, 210 Senior, didn't play his Sophomore season due to two knee surgeries.

He has racked up All-State numbers in leading the Kingsmen defense this season.

Watson leads Penn with eight QB sacks and 12 QB pressures. He has four tackles for loss.

Watson has also forced two fumbles, and he clinched Penn's Sectional Championship with a strip-sack and fumble recovery to end Crown Point's final drive as the Kingsmen upset the No. 2-ranked and previously unbeaten Bulldogs 28-24.

FREEMAN PICKS IVY LEAGUE SCHOOL FOR WRESTLING

Penn High School's Vinny Freeman, one of the state's top wrestlers, will continue his education and wrestling career at Cornell University.

Freeman, a three-time state qualifier and regional champion, claimed that Cornell's unique blend of prestigious academics and Division I wrestling was a perfect fit for him.

"I chose Cornell since it tests me in all aspects," Freeman said. "I yearned for a university where I could challenge myself in the classroom and on the mat. Everything seemed right — the coaches, the culture, the academics — everything.

Freeman said the Penn Wrestling program helped him become the athlete and person he is today, so much of his success comes from there.

"Penn Wrestling gave me ground-breaking instruction on how to remain disciplined, and how to lead," Freeman said. "Every day, Coach Harper and the rest of the staff pushed me, believing in me. Without them, I would not be committing to Cornell."

Penn head coach Harper said Freeman's dedication is inspiring.

"Vinny is the kind of athlete that earns everything he gets," Harper said. "He is among the most focused competitors I have coached, a fantastic teammate, and a student of the sport. Cornell is receiving someone especially unique.

Freeman leaves behind a legacy of toughness and leadership at Penn that will inspire upcoming Kingsmen wrestlers for years to come as he gets ready to enroll in one of the elite programs in the Ivy League.

Freeman, a linebacker for the Penn Football team, also serves as a team captain for the Kingsmen on the gridiron.

WALLIS ATTRACTING D-1 ATTENTION

Linebacker Noah Wallis has attracted plenty of attention from college coaches.

The 6-1, 205 Sophomore has already had recruiting visits to Georgia, Notre Dame, Indiana and Michigan State.

Wallis has made an impact as a Sophomore. He leads the team with 51 primary tackles, and leads the Wild Bunch with 67 tackles overall.

Wallis has five tackles for loss, five quarterback pressures, forced two fumbles and returned one fumble for a touchdown. He also has one blocked punt.

CLEARING THE WAY

Penn's offensive line -- tight end Carson Bays, right tackle Adrien Brown, right guard Patrick Conery, center A.J. Needham, left guard Charlie Henning and left tackle Wyatt Berger -- has been exceptional in 2025.

The Gold Rush Offense has piled up 3,930 yards of total offense in 11 games. The Kingsmen have only allowed 14 sacks in 488 plays.

The offensive line has been clutch in key plays, leading the way to 25 third-down conversions (36.2 percent) and six fourth-down conversions (50 percent).

CENTER OF ATTENTION

Penn's A.J. Needham switched from guard to be the Kingsmen center this season.

The 6-foot-5, 294-pound Junior is attracting plenty of college attention.

Needham has been invited to GameDay events by Purdue, Western Michigan and Toledo, among others.

WALSH UNIVERSITY NEXT STOP FOR BAYS

The next chapter of Carson Bays' athletic and academic career is officially set in motion. Bays, a standout lacrosse player, has announced his commitment to Walsh University, where he will compete at the Division II level in one of the most competitive Lacrosse conferences in the country.

For Carson, the decision came down to several important factors, but above all, it was the coaching staff and team culture that stood out most.

"I just liked the culture and the coach—it felt like home," Bays said. "They weren't really a strong program, but when the new coach came in, they had a pretty good season, and I want to be part of building that success."

Game 1: Aug. 22, 2025

PENN 21, Valparaiso 13 At Valparaiso High School

Colden Hernandez intercepted two passes, blocked a point-after touchdown kick and scored on a 72-yard touchdown run as Penn turned back Valparaiso, 21-13 in the 2025 Varsity Football season opener on Friday.

Valparaiso drove to the Penn 12 but Kendal Schaffer forced a fumble that Kenny Welsh recovered to end the Vikings' threat with 1:19 left in the game.

Hernandez, a 5-foot-10, 179-pound Senior, starts at Cornerback for the Kingsmen. He made a diving interception for Penn at the Kingsmen 3 in the first half, and made a sensational leaping theft in the end zone in the fourth quarter to stop another Valpo threat.

Used for two plays on offense, Hernandez took a handoff in the first quarter, made a stunning cut and raced 72 yards for Penn's first TD. Hernandez has experience on offense. He started as a Wildcat quarterback on the Penn JV Team as a Sophomore.

Kingsmen quarterback Landon Hall turned in an exceptional showing, completing 11-of-17 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns. Hall, a 6-4, 204 Junior, commanded a Gold Rush offense that committed no turnovers.
