Game Notes

Penn leads the series 3-2. ... Crown Point has won the last two meetings (2024 and 2023). ... The Bulldogs beat Penn 35-0 in the Sectional 1 final last season, and defeated Penn 34-33 in a Class 6-A Regional in 2023. ... Penn averages 43.5 points a game this season and allows 8.7 points a game. ... Crown Point scores 38.5 points a game and allows 10.1 points a game. ... Sophomore Mason Biernacki has had a breakthrough season for the Kingsmen. ... He has 29 catches for 639 yards. ... Senior linebacker Wrigley Hull is third on the team with 49 tackles and has five quarterback sacks, two QB pressures, two tackles for loss and one interception. ... Junior QB Tyce Custy leads Crown Point with 66-of-97 passing (66 percent) for 993 yards and nine TDs. ... Cooper Malaski is 34-of-53 (64 percent) for 481 yards passing and six TDs.

Penn coach Pete Riordan

Pete Riordan was named the seventh head coach of the Kingsmen Football Program in March of 2024.

He was an assistant coach on the Kingsmen Football staff for 20 years (most recently serving as Defensive Coordinator).

Riordan has coached in four State Championship Football games as an assistant with the Kingsmen (2003, 2011, 2015 and 2017).

Riordan owns a state championship legacy. He played on the 1995 South Bend St. Joseph State Championship Football Team and was a three-year starter. He earned a B.A. from Wabash and earned an MBA in Finance from Indiana University South Bend.

NEXT ROUND

The winner of the Penn (10-0) vs. Crown Point (10-0) game plays the winner of the Fort Wayne Northrop (8-2) at Fort Wayne Carroll (7-3) game in a Regional Championship match on Friday, Nov. 14.

If Penn beats Crown Point, the Kingsmen would host Carroll, or play at Northrop.

If Crown Point beats Penn, the Bulldogs would host Carroll or host Northrop.

HOISTING THE HARDWARE

Penn boasts 26 Sectional Championships in Football. The Kingsmen last claimed a Sectional Championship in 2023 (Sectional 2).

Crown Point has won nine Sectional Championships in Football, including the last two seasons (Sectional 1).

Penn has won five State Championships (1983, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000).

Crown Point is seeking its first State Championship.

HERNANDEZ DOUBLE TROUBLE FOR OPPONENTS

Penn Senior Colden Hernandez (5-foot-11, 179-pound Senior) is one of the top impact players on both sides of the ball in Indiana.

On defense, Hernandez has five interceptions (include two Pick-6's) and has broken up six passes.

On offense, Hernandez is Penn's leading rusher with seven touchdowns and 279 yards. He averages 6.5 yards a carry.

Hernandez has also been a force on special teams. He has blocked two kicks, and returns punts and kickoffs.

HALL RACKING UP AMAZING NUMBERS

Penn quarterback Landon Hall, a 6-4, 203 Junior, has turned the passing pocket into a launching pad for Penn's Gold Rush offense.

The Power 4 college prospect is bringing the heat, connecting on 83-of-110 passes for a dazzling 75.5 percent completion percentage. He has fired off 21 touchdown strikes this season and has only been intercepted twice. His quarterback rating is an astronomical 149.

Hall has passed for 1,694 yards this season, usually only playing in the first half of games due to the Kingsmen winning by an average of 34.8 points a game.

HURLEY CATCHES ON

All-State candidate Brayson Hurley is a prime target in Penn's aerial attack.

A 6-4, 218 Junior, Hurley has hauled in 38 catches for 771 yards and eight touchdowns. His longest touchdown was an 82-yard run after a catch from quarterback Landon Hall. Hurley averages 77.1 receiving yards a game.

Hurley has also contributed to the Kingsmen special teams, averaging 32.67 yards a kickoff. He has one kickoff return for a touchdown (89 yards).

Hurley also stepped up to be the long snapper on field-goal and point-after touchdown kicks.

FREEMAN PICKS IVY LEAGUE SCHOOL FOR WRESTLING

Penn High School's Vinny Freeman, one of the state's top wrestlers, will continue his education and wrestling career at Cornell University.

Freeman, a three-time state qualifier and regional champion, claimed that Cornell's unique blend of prestigious academics and Division I wrestling was a perfect fit for him.

"I chose Cornell since it tests me in all aspects," Freeman said. "I yearned for a university where I could challenge myself in the classroom and on the mat. Everything seemed right — the coaches, the culture, the academics — everything.

Freeman said the Penn Wrestling program helped him become the athlete and person he is today, so much of his success comes from there.

"Penn Wrestling gave me ground-breaking instruction on how to remain disciplined, and how to lead," Freeman said. "Every day, Coach Harper and the rest of the staff pushed me, believing in me. Without them, I would not be committing to Cornell."

Penn head coach Harper said Freeman's dedication is inspiring.

"Vinny is the kind of athlete that earns everything he gets," Harper said. "He is among the most focused competitors I have coached, a fantastic teammate, and a student of the sport. Cornell is receiving someone especially unique.

Freeman leaves behind a legacy of toughness and leadership at Penn that will inspire upcoming Kingsmen wrestlers for years to come as he gets ready to enroll in one of the elite programs in the Ivy League.

Freeman, a linebacker for the Penn Football team, also serves as a team captain for the Kingsmen on the gridiron.

FOUR-SPORT STAR

Christian Bonner, a 6-1, 240 Senior Defensive Lineman, is a four-sport star for the Kingsmen.

Bonner is one of leaders of Penn's Wild Bunch defense with five tackles for loss, four QB pressures, two quarterback sacks and a pass deflection that led to a Pick-6.

He is also a key player on the Kingsmen Boys Basketball Team.

In the Spring, Bonner competes for the Boys Track & Field Team, and he helped lead the Boys Volleyball Team to a Sectional Championship in its first season.

DEFENSIVE FORCE

Penn's defense has been a dominant force this season. The Kingsmen boast four Pick-6s – two by Colden Hernandez, and one each by Ethan Horner and John White. Penn has racked up 23 sacks, led by Quinn Watson with seven sacks.

WALLIS ATTRACTING D-1 ATTENTION

Linebacker Noah Wallis has attracted plenty of attention from college coaches.

The 6-1, 205 Sophomore has already had recruiting visits to Georgia, Notre Dame, Indiana and Michigan State.

Wallis has made an impact as a Sophomore. He leads the team with 45 primary tackles, and leads the Wild Bunch with 60 tackles overall.

Wallis five tackles for loss, four quarterback sacks, forced two fumbles and returned one fumble for a touchdown. He also has one blocked punt.

CLEARING THE WAY

Penn's offensive line -- tight end Carson Bays, right tackle Adrien Brown, right guard Patrick Conery, center A.J. Needham, left guard Charlie Henning and left tackle Wyatt Berger -- has been exceptional in 2025.

The Gold Rush Offense has piled up 3,513 yards of total offense in 10 games. The Kingsmen have only allowed 14 sacks in 428 plays.

The offensive line has been clutch in key plays, leading the way to 23 third-down conversions (39.7 percent) and five fourth-down conversions (45 percent).

Colden Hernandez intercepted two passes, blocked a point-after touchdown kick and scored on a 72-yard touchdown run as Penn turned back Valparaiso, 21-13 in the 2025 Varsity Football season opener on Friday.

Valparaiso drove to the Penn 12 but Kendal Schaffer forced a fumble that Kenny Welsh recovered to end the Vikings' threat with 1:19 left in the game.

Hernandez, a 5-foot-10, 179-pound Senior, starts at Cornerback for the Kingsmen. He made a diving interception for Penn at the Kingsmen 3 in the first half, and made a sensational leaping theft in the end zone in the fourth quarter to stop another Valpo threat.
